

Need a refresher on how to obtain the forms? Feel free to send me an email. D-1 Scholarship Chair Townsend has included information on Language Camp 2021 Scholarships in this newsletter too – please check for any deadlines. Lots of "stuff" to do even when we do not meet!

- The Granlund Lodge in Fosston reported that they have not met in regular meetings for the last few months. They worked on their bylaws and made some significant changes. The officers recently met in person to plan for the next few months. Once the members get vaccinated, more in person lodge meetings will be planned.
- The Vikingland Lodge in Detroit Lakes reported that they have a new slate of officers for this year with many staying on in their former positions. They do have a new President, Dean Johnson. They have been meeting as a board via zoom to plan for the new year. They conducted a parking lot bake sale in November and raised over \$500 for their lodge.
- The Bemidji Lodge seems to be functioning as best as they can. They are having a "show and tell" zoom meeting on January 31 at 2:00.
- Snorre Lodge from Thief River Falls last fall participated in the "Meals on Wheels" program for our community. There were new rules for meal distribution due to the Covid virus. They have not been meeting regularly, but for our annual Christmas party this year, they held a drive-thru dinner instead. It was a free meal for Lodge members, and all received a small gift. The Lodge held an in-person board of directors meeting recently to plan and move forward with lodge activities. They decided to hold a regular lodge meeting the end of February. Lunch will not be served at these meetings. The board also decided to give lodge members a refund of \$25 when they pay their dues this year. A newsletter is going out to the membership to explain these changes.

Some of Lodges have started revising their By-Laws and most Lodges are hopeful that they will be back to hosting some membership events in late spring and summer.





# Summer 2021 Camp

Skogfjorden has not yet decided on their 2021 camp dates. Because of that, you have not yet received your usual scholarship packets. This article is to update you on the information we do have, and the changes that will be in place for the 2021 camp season.

- 1. District scholarships remain at \$150 per week per villager/camper based on the your lodge membership numbers as of December 31, 2020. The exact amount available to your lodge will be mailed to you as soon as we have all necessary information. If you need to know the exact amount your lodge has available to them, email me as I have those numbers ready. Skogfjorden information dates, when available can be found on <a href="http://www.concordialanguagevillages.org">http://www.concordialanguagevillages.org</a>.
- 2. Skogfjorden has determined that it will have both virtual and in person sessions this year, and district scholarships can be used for both/either.
- 3. Masse Moro dates and costs are \$850 per session and camp dates are July 18 31, 2021. Registration is due by May 17ith. Registration, required forms and additional information are available at <a href="http://www.MasseMoro.org">http://www.MasseMoro.org</a>.
- 4. District forms will be available on the District Website at: <a href="https://district1scholarship.weebly.com">https://district1scholarship.weebly.com</a>, or email me for any forms you need.
- 5. Mikal Kartvedt Skogfjorden Scholarship for Villagers requesting financial assistance and Information about Norwegian Folk High School Scholarships remains the same as last year. These forms should be submitted by April 1st. If this causes an issue, please email or call me and we will work with you to make these scholarships possible.
- 6. The Mikal Kartvedt scholarship is underused. Please encourage any campers you think would benefit from it, to apply for it.
- 7. Normally youth must receive a lodge level scholarship in order to qualify for a district level scholarship. Because of the inability of some lodges to meet and hold fund raising events this year, lodges are encouraged to give lodge scholarships as they can, but these are not required in order for lodges to award 2021 district scholarships to qualifying lodge youth.
